**2018 International Energy Conservation Code (iECC)  
and State Building Code Council**

The Honolulu Resilience Office of Climate Change, Sustainability and Resiliency and Department of Planning and Permitting are working together on Oahu's adoption of the 2018 International Energy Conservation Code (iECC0 local amendments. Proposed energy code changes are in the works and affects all construction industries!

The Investigative Committee of The State Building Code Council (SBCC) reviews and make any amendments to the 2018 International Energy Conservation Code after first receiving it from the Federal government. They then forward it to the City & County of Honolulu to do their reviews and make any language amendments before the City adopts the final version.

If you would like updates on energy codes and their development, please contact both Howard Wiig and Karen Shishido to be added to their email distribution list. As it is 2022, there is a lot of resistance to NOT adopt the international code as many items do not pertain to Hawaii.
