





SB 2386 exempts construction contracts from the Procurement Code for small purchases. Our industry opposes this bill.

The current small purchase procurement threshold for construction is a maximum of \$250,000 (https://www.capitol.hawaii.gov/hrscurrent/Vol02_Ch0046-0115/hrs0103D/HRS_0103D-0305.htm) which does not require low bid or sublisting. SB2386 is proposing to exempt such small purchase construction procurements from the small purchase process all together, as long as the CPO determines that the purchases are available from multiple sources but for which procurement by competitive means is either not practicable or not advantageous to the State.

The requests for exemptions from the procurement code 103d, are listed on the State Procurement Office (SPO) website with a copy of the request and status of award. So in effect there is public oversight on these procurement exemptions. Furthermore, such exemption requests are required to be posted for 7 days prior to approval. That being the case, the only remaining issue is whether the agencies are required to obtain three prices, etc. similar to what is required by small purchases.

The Senate Government Operations Committee passed out SB 2386 taking smaller contracts (\$250,000 and under) out of the procurement code. This would apply any time but the goal is so agencies do not have to "re-procure" a project when they discover some additional work has to be done that was not part of the original procurement process. That means that all those small contracts would be without sublist protections as well possibly payment protections. The SPO says they will still be listed on the website so they are protected. We asked that the provisions be confined to those where additional work is discovered but only for those that had gone through the full procurement process originally. The Chair asked about our amendment but the agencies resisted and she went with them.

The bill goes to Senate Ways and Means but the Chair (Senator Donovan Dela Cruz) is Vice Chair of Senator Moriwaki's Committee so he will probably pass it. Negative testimony can help to flag the problem and have them think twice down the road in Conference Committee if it cannot be stopped in the House.
